This is a national system, so multiple clubs of the same name may pop up. Choose your Club Name Northwest District, Missouri Federation of Square & Round Dance Clubs. Choose the one with Your Club USDA number.

A handout with information for Caller/Cuer Hall of Fame and Dancer of the year were passed out to the presidents. This can be found in the Standing Rules.

Also, the 60th MO State Festival asked that each club in the state give a free pass to the festival to be used as a door prize. There was discussion about the fact that there was a good possibility that the pass might not be used because of dancer and club locations.

- 3. No club longevity awards to be given at this time.
- 4. We have 47 clubs in the Federation which includes one new club in the Southwest District the Pioneers.
- 5. Publications electronic version of DOIN's is going well.
- 6. A discussion on Dan's web site. Because all clubs whether they belong to the Missouri Federation or not are listed on it. After much discussion it was decided to leave the web site as it is because people from all over the country use it to find dances in Missouri when they are passing through. The DOIN'S will continue to list only federation dances.
- 7. Insurance information will now be entered electronically by the clubs from now on.
- 8. Travel Missouri stated that 3115 dangles have been earned by dancers.
- 9. the Web Master again stated that if you send a sheet of information to PLEASE but the date in lower right hand corner. This is so he know if it is an update or just another copy of what he has already recived.
- 10. Districts Presidents report one vote per office. St Louis area is considering merger due to unbalance of men and woman at some dances.
- 11. New youth chairman stated that the 4H is adding square dancing to their activities. Those who take part in Square Dancing can win dangles for various achievements. The best caller will go to State Fair. We are also trying to see if FFA would be interested in including Square Dancing in their activities.
- 12. 2019 State Festival has 180 pre registered and packets our out. They asked if two new callers could call at Festival it was decided they could not call as they do not meet requirements set in constitution.
- 13. The 2020 State Festival committee requested \$2500.00 as start up money. The 2020 State Festival will be held in Sedalia, MO on October 16 18, 2020 the color for this dance will burgundy.
- 14. The June 2 2019 meeting will be in Central District at Eldon County Fair Grounds.

Subject: 4-H report

The Director of the state of Missouri's 4-H Maria Lupita Fabregas met with representatives of the Missouri State Square dance federation on March 25th to discuss adding square dance as a 4-H project. The following ideas were discussed:

- 4-H Club Making the activity fun
- Use sashes, vest, badges or dangles as awards
- Dance portion Award each mastery of 11 moves. Maybe have a vest for boys and sash or vest for girls
 with a square dance emblem on it. To attach the dangles or badges, Different colors for mainstream,
 plus, round dance, lines, barn dances, contra.
- Calling portion award different dangles for calling modules and sight, mini squares, mainstream singers, mainstream patter, plus singers, plus patter, Hot hash, round dance and barn dance/contra.
- Sewing portion different dangles. Sewing square dance, and blouses, or vest and sashes, neckties, prairie skirts
- Maybe different dangles if a 4-H participant gives a history of square dance, style of square dance, the evolution of square dance, and the same for contra, line dance and round dance.
- Additional badges for attending dance parties, square dancing at state fair, at state square dance and at nationals.
- Sponsor dance party nights during the year and have the kids plan and put on the dance party.
- At county fair for competition to see which dancers move on to state have a square dance and a last square standing or hothash competition. Have potential callers call and judge their ability with a tip.
- Then at state fair have a square dance, have the participants call and dance, Then end with a last square standing. To see what group wins.
- Have a competition for hot hash to see which callers can win.
- Include in the dance round dances, line dances, and contra.

- Showcasing how folk dance has been part of the agricultural history or Missouri and America. How
 Barn dances were a big part of weddings and celebrations in rural America. They were one of the major
 social events in rural America and pioneer life.
- Follow the Standard curriculum used to teach square dance in schools. And supplement that with teaching lines, contra, barn dance and traditional country dances like Virginia Reel, and round dance if there is an interest.
- Resources, local square dance clubs, local callers, the Missouri Federation of Square and Round Dance, Caller lab, Roundalab, The American Callers Association,

Maria liked all of our ideas and wanted to start a pilot program in Lynn, Macon, Lewis, and Randolph counties. She suggested we use our normal teaching protocols. However, she did caution that anyone working as a volunteer with 4-h kids would need to get a background check and take a volunteer course that is provided online concerning proper leader skills and interaction with youth.

The background check will not cost anything.

She also suggested we focus on healthy living and culture as our avenue into 4-H. Maria mentioned that volunteer project leaders would be required to have a minimum of 6 one hour to one hour and 1/2 meetings. She also mentioned that we might consider doing workshops at 4-h camps. She said there were several throughout the year and throughout the state each year. Apparently they are heavily attended. She mentioned there are over 60,000 4-h participants.

Maybe the kids could demo and teach at the 4-H conferences.

I will provide a copy of a flyer for the 4-H clubs in our area to distribute.
